Ceramic production in Viet Nam has a long and rich history. From the discovery of 10,000 year-old earthenware shards in mountain caves of northern Viet Nam to the revolutionary changes in designs, glazes and shapes that were introduced during the Ly, Tran, Le and Mac dynastic periods (11th-17th centuries), ceramic production has taken its place as one of Viet Nam's most important artistic expressions.

Join us for a presentation by VACEF Board of Directors member James Brow on Viet Nam's ceramic history. During the 24 years he lived and worked in Asia (including 12 years in Viet Nam), Mr. Brow researched and wrote on the history and development of Vietnamese ceramics. His presentation will include images of his family's personal collection, which spans the major production periods.
